The Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Program (SAPR) reinforces the Air Force's commitment to prevention through the development, implementation and assessment of policies and programs to prevent and respond to sexual assault. These policies and programs are designed to empower Airmen, fostering an environment that cultivates a culture of dignity, mutual respect and trust.

Reporting Options

Restricted Reporting:

Without notifying command or law enforcement:

- Access to medical, advocacy, legal, and counseling services
- Receive the Sexual Assault Forensic Examination (SAFE)
- Can change to Unrestricted Report at any time
- Special Victims' Counsel
- CATCH Program

Unrestricted Reporting:

Triggers an official investigation and command notification:

- Access to medical, advocacy, legal, and counseling services
- Receive the SAFE
- Alleged offender may be held accountable
- Command support
- Can receive a Military Protective Order
- Special Victims' Counsel
- Expedited Transfer

Limited SAPR Services for Sexual Harassment

- Referrals to resources (legal, mental health services, others)
- Support in filing retaliation complaints
- Support in obtaining Military/Civilian Protective Orders
- Special Victims' Counsel consultation and representation

Delivers victim centered advice and advocacy through comprehensive, independent representation to sexual assault victims, assists them in obtaining support and recovery resources, and promotes greater confidence in the military justice process and the United States Air Force

Volunteer Victim Advocate

Provides essential victim support and care to the victim to include providing non-clinical information on available options and resources to assist the victim in making informed decisions as they progress through resolution and healing.
